**Catechetical Sunday  
September 20, 2009**

Sunday, September 20, 2009 is Catechetical Sunday. For the year ahead catechetical communities will explore the theme "Catechesis and the Proclamation of the Word – La Catequesis y la Proclamación de la Palabra." It was in 1971 that the United States Council of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Department of Education began producing materials to

help parishes celebrate the event at the local level. The tradition has continued uninterrupted with a theme for each year being selected nationally and promoted in parishes and diocesan offices throughout the United States. Annually, the USCCB publishes materials for celebrations on this the third Sunday in September. This resource has grown to include articles on a wide variety of catechetical topics and the annual theme, liturgy planning helps, prayer services, prayer cards, posters, commissioning certificates, clip art, as well as seasonal bulletin inserts and prayer services for use throughout the year. Since 1982 all these materials have been available in both Spanish and English. Beginning this year, they are available online at no expense to us! In the Archdiocese of San Antonio, Catechetical Sunday has been celebrated for many years. It is an outstanding time to honor parish and school catechists. One important way that catechists are recognized is through Catechist Certification. In 1985 the Archdiocesan Catechetical Center began awarding Catechist Certification. That first year 120 catechists were certified on the Basic Level. The following year, in 1986, the

Catechetical Center began awarding Catechist Certification on four levels—Basic, Intermediate, Advanced and Professional. At the same time, we began to celebrate these certifications with an Archdiocesan-wide prayer service and ceremony held on the first weekend of June. We encouraged parishes to celebrate the achievement of the newly certified within the parish community by providing prayer services in both English and Spanish. In 1993, we moved the celebration of Catechetical Certification to September to align with the Church in the United States celebration of Catechetical Sunday. In 1999, we began honoring all those who were newly certified during the year in a "special recognition page" in the Today's Catholic issue which coincided with Catechetical Sunday. Seven years ago, we asked Today's Catholic to time the annual issue featuring catechesis with this national initiative. Watch for the September 11, 2009 issue of Today's Catholic to read our special issue insert and see the back page list of \_\_\_\_\_ catechists who have achieved certification in 2008-2009.

I look forward to sharing in good work of Proclaiming the Word of God through catechesis in the coming year. May your

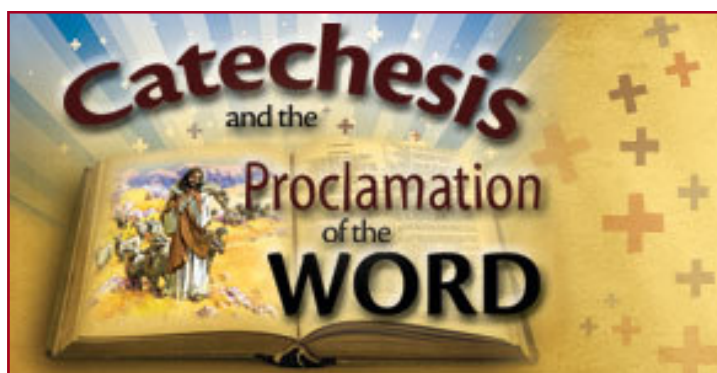

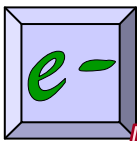

**MANDATES FOR ALL PARISH AND SCHOOL  
CATECHETICAL AND YOUTH MINISTRY LEADERS IN THE  
ARCHDIOCESE OF SAN ANTONIO  
CERTIFICATE YEAR 2009-2010**

**1. ARCHDIOCESAN SEXUAL MISCONDUCT POLICY**

All parish and school **employees** and all volunteer personnel in any capacity must view the **Archdiocese of San Antonio Sexual Misconduct Policy video and read the booklet before they begin their ministry. There are no exceptions!**

All employees and volunteers must also sign and complete the Archdiocesan Sexual Misconduct **Policy Certificate**. **For more information or to request more booklets, please contact the Human Resources Office at 210-734-2620, extension 1163.**

**2. CRIMINAL BACKGROUND SEARCH POLICY**

The policy of the Archdiocese of San Antonio requires that criminal background searches be conducted on all clergy and employees. Criminal background searches must also be conducted on all volunteers who directly minister, work or volunteer with minors and/or vulnerable persons. No other criminal background searches are acceptable in lieu of the Archdiocesan criminal background search.

Employees and volunteers are asked to complete the ***Criminal Background Search Authorization and Release Form***. Refusal to sign and complete this form will result in immediate termination and/or suspension of services.

Criminal background searches will be conducted on all new employees and new volunteers who directly minister, work, or volunteer with minors and/or vulnerable persons and updated every three years on existing employees and volunteers.

**3. CHILD ABUSE**

It is a legal requirement that anyone who is aware of or suspects that a child (anyone under the age of 18 yrs) is being abused must report this incident to the proper authorities. Please follow guidelines outlined in the **Archdiocese of San Antonio Sexual Misconduct Policy**. Professionals are required to report within 48 hours by calling 800-252-5400. Do not probe for information. If you are concerned and can provide the name and address of the child, **CALL**. Child Protective Services or Law Enforcement will investigate.

**4. The Office of Victim Assistance & Safe Environment** is able to work with the victims of abuse. If you or anyone you know is being abused, or has been abused in the past, by the clergy, staff or volunteer of the church, please contact Steve Martinez, LCSW, LSOTP, at 210-734-7786 or 1-877-700-1888 immediately. They will assess the situation and make sure the victim gets needed information.

**5. OVASE- Safe Environment Abuse Prevention Education**

Beginning in 2004, every parish, school and institution must incorporate an abuse prevention program with all children, pre-school thru high school, and to parents. This is not a separate program, it is content information to be included in religious education and youth ministry education. Every parish has a named coordinator who can educate catechists to implement the mandatory program. In addition, the data on dates and numbers instructed must be reported to coordinators for audit purposes. For questions, call your local coordinator or Steve Martinez 210-734-7786.

**6. PERMISSION SLIP REQUIREMENTS**

All children under the age of eighteen (18) must have a permission slip signed by their parents or legal guardian yearly for the following:

- a. Consent Forms for medical treatment
- b. Field Trip Permission Slips
- c. Permission to meet in homes or locations outside of church premises.  
\*An adult, not a family member, other than the homeowners must be present at all classes.  
\*Homeowners must have some type of Liability Insurance.
- d. Permission to participate in other church related functions not specifically related to Religious Education.  
Sample forms may be obtained from the Archdiocesan Catechetical Center or the Office of Youth Ministry.

**7. FIELD TRIP PACKETS**

Make sure you have obtained the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of the custodial parents or guardians. It is especially important to obtain all the necessary information on Field Trips, Weekend Retreats and activities off church property. Field Trip Guide packets can be obtained from Risk Management Office. Please review Field Trip memo of 5-28-98.

**8. CATECHIST POLICY**

- a. All classrooms must have at least one adult teacher or catechist (18 yrs or older) present at all times. Anyone under the age of 18 should never be left alone with children.
- b. There should always be adult supervision before and after all classes, regardless of the ages of the children. Proper procedure will be indicated by each location. Catechists should not transport children home.
- c. If possible, two adults should be together at all times, when working with children as protection against allegations of misconduct.

**9. INSURANCE**

If you have a written contract or agreement with a retreat center or camp, please forward a copy of the contract or agreement to our office as soon as possible. Please contact Risk Management before you purchase any outside insurance for Retreats, Field Trips, etc. This coverage may already be in force. All Adult Volunteers, Students, and Religious Education Students are now covered under a blanket policy.

**10. ARCHDIOCESAN DRIVER POLICY**

Any employee or volunteer who drives an Archdiocese owned or leased vehicle must have an Archdiocese Driving Permit (renewal every three years) and must attend an approved Defensive Driving Class (within a year of employment). **10 to 15 passenger vans are prohibited from being used to transport children. Drivers must be at least 21 years of age to transport children.** If a volunteer drives a personal vehicle for church sponsored activities or business, then the individual must carry proper insurance requirements and must fill out the **Volunteer Driver Information Sheet** that is available through the Office of Risk Management.

**11. COPYRIGHT INFORMATION**

It is a Federal Offence to copy materials, music, or videos for distribution without permission of the author, composer, or publisher. Contact the ACC Office for assistance or questions on copyright issues. It is theft to copy words or music in sacrament programs or booklets for parish use without a license number or permission.

## THE ANGEL'S LESSONS SERIES

**006116 Advent Lesson 11 min PIJ**

Danny is happily making out his Christmas list; adding more and more toys and games when his Guardian Angel, Theophane, suddenly appears. It is obvious to Theo that Danny has forgotten the real meaning of Christmas. Together they review practices like the Advent wreath, reciting daily prayers at home and doing daily acts of kindness.

**006117 Church Year Lesson 11 min PIJ**

Angels Vita, Caritas, and Benedicta take children on a journey through the church year to assure them that Jesus is with them always. The angels open a special "blessing" book that takes them (and the Children Watching) into their journey. Children learn about what happened to Jesus in each church season, including Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, and Ordinary Time.

**006118 First Reconciliation Lesson 12 min PIJ**

This delightful video offers Children information about friendship with Jesus, forgiveness, and the Rite of Penance, and it walks with children through the various steps of the rite. Though this DVD is primarily for children preparing for first reconciliation, it can be used with any lesson on the sacrament of reconciliation or forgiveness. Includes an "Agenda for a Parent Meeting."

**006121 Prayer Lessons 12 min PIJ**

Angel Callista, with the help of her unseen angel friends, enthusiastically teaches children about prayer and the many forms it can take. She asks the students to join her in Prayers of praise and thanksgiving, prayers of petition, and prayers of sorrow. Callista also talks about the Mass, personal and communal prayer, and family prayer, just to name a few of the many other ways to pray.

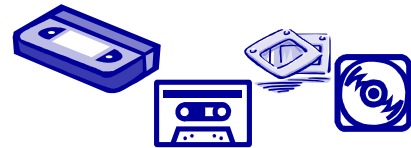
