From the Director . . .



For most of the country, winter still grasps tightly to landscape, and freezing temperatures keep it in dormancy. But for us, the Lenten springtime has

begun – I saw the first bluebonnets over the weekend – and the Lord’s promise of renewed hope and grace is being fulfilled.

It was a joy to have the chance to meet many of you during our Mid-Winter Gathering last month, one of our most successful yet. It was my first opportunity to hear Archbishop Gustavo Garcia-Siller teach directly as our Chief Catechist, and it was most instructive to see and hear him use the Scriptures in his comments on the Eucharist. It was a living, breathing example of the communication of Divine Revelation through the twin well-springs of Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture. As *Dei Verbum* (*The Word of God* – Vatican II) puts it: “For both of them...come together to form one thing and move towards the same goal. So in maintaining, practicing, and professing the faith that has been handed on, there should be a remarkable harmony between the bishops and the faithful.” (DV 9,10) God willing, we’ll have many more

opportunities in the future to appreciate the dynamic and insightful presence of Archbishop Gustavo.

We also heard something about the upcoming changes to the Mass due to the implementation of the 3rd edition of the Roman Missal from myself and Rita Minkley – due to take effect in all parishes in the United States on November 27, 2011 – ready or not here it comes! If you haven’t already, go to <http://www.usccb.org/romanmissal/> for up-to-date information, sample texts and suggested parish resources (be sure to read about others on page 12 and educate yourself about rumors and inaccuracies on page 9). In addition, be watching upcoming issues of **Pathways** and the weekly e-alerts for additional resources and materials specifically designed for catechetical leaders to use with catechists, parents and families, and students of various grade levels.

Seldom do we have this type of opportunity to get people’s attention and help to inspire a fuller understanding and deeper appreciation of the liturgy! Let’s not waste this possibility of fostering a more “full, conscious and active participation called for in the very nature of the

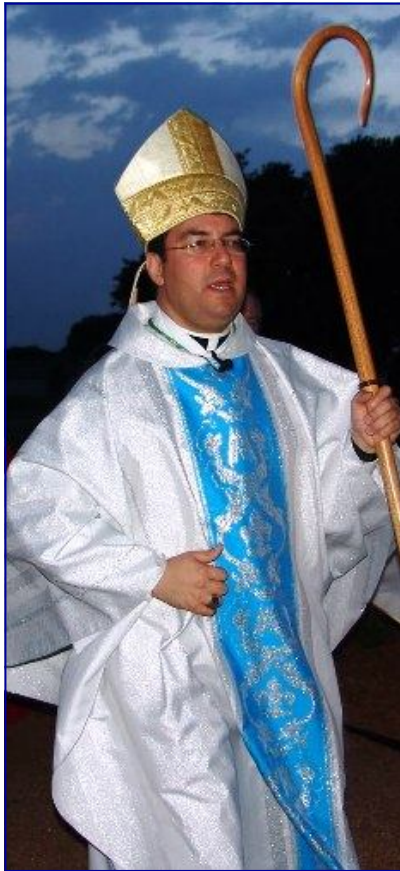

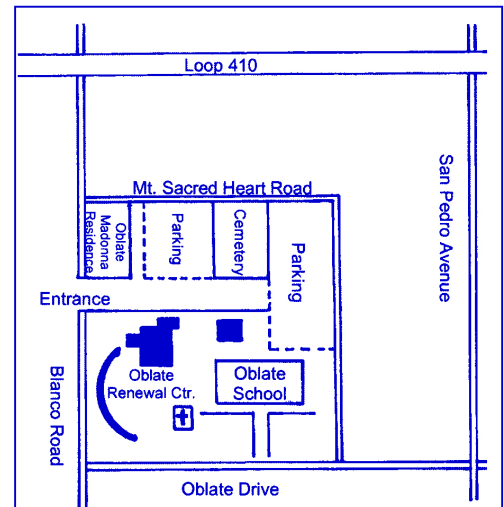

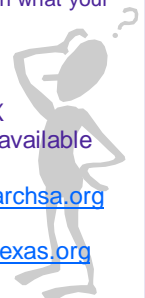

The Roman Missal... Rumors, Misconceptions and other inaccuracies...

RUMOR 1: Current songs and hymns will be banned

NOTHING could be further from the truth! The songs that you sing for Mass will continue. If you use a songbook or liturgical worship aid from any of the 3 major Catholic publishers – GIA, WLP, or OCP – you will have no problem. Our Bishops do have specific rules in how to “judge” particular pieces of music and their publication and how that will work. RUMOR 2: Only Chant will be allowed with the new Missal

FALSE, FALSE, FALSE! There are new chant melodies written for the new Missal and the dialogue prayers. Since these are contained within the new Missal, these will be the noted Mass in every publication. That is, the chants will be what you see when you open a missalette to follow along. HOWEVER, this is only to help all of us learn and use the new chants. We were never before given that opportunity with the current Sacramentary. The OTHER Mass settings will be found in the appendix of each hymnal and worship aid just like before.

RUMOR 3: Songs with the word “YAHWEH” have been banned

AGAIN, FALSE! The US Committee on Divine Worship asked the Vatican Congregation for clarification because some National Conferences of Bishops (like Canada) had declared that the use of that word was Sacred and was to be observed, that is, not used in our Lectionary and music. However, other Conferences (like ours) had NOT issued this guideline. The Congregation finally put out a notice stating that you cannot use the name of God “YHWH” in Liturgy: <http://www.usccb.org/liturgy/NameOfGod.pdf>. In music, that word is to be changed to “Lord” in English and “Señor” in Spanish. Songs that have been around ARE STILL HERE – just with a word change! OCP has updated all of their materials; pdfs available: <http://www.ocp.org/directive08>. And GIA has as well: http://www.giamusic.com/sacred_music/vatican_directive.cfm.

With all the change happening this November, we don't need to add any misinformation to our explanations! Make sure to do some research before stating a “fact” – and if anyone tells you something, challenge that individual to show you the document to back it up!

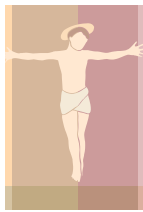

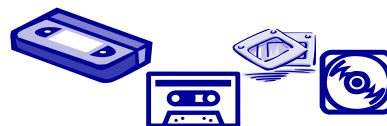

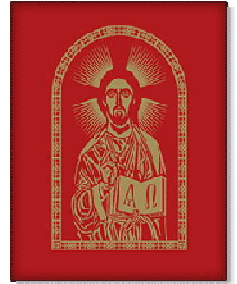
