Transportation and number of campers and adult supervision

With every 6 youth campers there should be one adult, and one vehicle to drive a team of 7 campers, the team of 7 should include a driver. Each Vehicle should have an ice chest, 5 gallon water jug, and a first aid kit, that stays in it.

Water and Snack

Church groups bring extra ice chests for snacks and bottled water. Bring one case of water for each person. There will be a snack area for you to store these items

Dress Code

MODESTY, this is a church event, so it is important that we dress respectfully.

- ✓ All shirts must have sleeves, no tight or low cut. Comfortable loose fit
- ✓ All shorts should be mid length or long, no short shorts, no rolling them up, loose fit.
- ✓ Bring a one piece bathing suit and flip flops for the showers
- ✓ No open toed shoes allowed on sites. Tennis shoes work good.
- ✓ Sleep wear should be modest, need a robe to walk to bathrooms.

What to bring?

Work Site: Every camper should have basic paint supplies. Paint pan, paint roller, paint brush, paint scrapper, gloves, work goggles, mask, wide masking tape, Water bottle, bug spray, sun protection and hat.

Personal Items: Single size sleeping bag or cot, linens, toiletries, towel, bathing suit, flip flops, and sleep wear, a snack to share, do not bring anything of value like jewelry or anything that cannot be lost.
