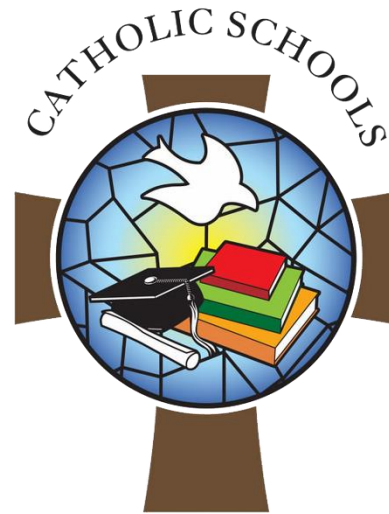

PILLAR II – SACRAMENTS

The student will:

SACRAMENTS

8. Demonstrate the importance of sacraments, with an emphasis on the centrality of the Eucharist, in the life of Catholics.

- 2.3.S Indicate that the sacrament of penance/reconciliation is a way to say we are sorry for our sins and celebrate God’s forgiveness.(CCC:1422-1424,1440-1442)
- 2.4.S Indicate that the sacrament of Eucharist was begun by Jesus at the Last Supper. (CCC:1403)
- 2.5.S Reflect how we celebrate the Eucharist at Mass as the bread and wine are changed into the body and blood of Jesus.(CCC:1382-1385,1406-1407)
